History Of Carenvale

The Carnevale of is an annual festival held in Venice, Italy, famous throughout the world for its elaborate costumes and masks. It ends on "Fat Tuesday" or "Shrove Tuesday" which is the day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday.

The Carnevale traces its origins to the Middle Ages, existing for several centuries until it was abolished in 1797. After a long absence, the Carnevale returned in 1979. Since then, approximately 3 million visitors have been coming to Venice every year for the Carnevale.

The Italian government decided to bring back the history and culture of Venice and sought to use the traditional Carnevale as the centerpiece of its efforts. The redevelopment of the masks began as the pursuit of some Venetian college students for the tourist trade. One of the most important events is the contest for "la maschera più bella" ("the most beautiful mask") which is judged by a panel of international costume and fashion designers.

The Dante Alighieri Society of Pueblo held their very first Carnevale celebration in 1980 and with the exception of a few years in between, has held this event every year since!
