Devo Tornare in Italia!


If you would've told me two years ago that I would be going to Italy in Fall 2017,

I would've told you that you're crazy, but that's exactly what I did. From the time the plane landed to the very last day, every moment I was there was amazing. Being in Bergamo, I wanted to take pictures every second, but I didn't want to seem like a tourist. I felt like I was stepping onto a movie set. Walking down those streets every day, looking into the little shops where clothing in the typical

Italian fashion was displayed, I came to enjoy this city so much that I didn't want to leave.

Part of the city, Città Alta was built on a hill and surrounded by walls. In Città Alta, the streets are all cobblestones and narrow. Here, no cars are allowed, unless they're delivery trucks. All my classes were up there, so I was able to enjoy the beauty of this part of

the city more. There are so many restaurants up there, but I think that my favorite was Funaiao. They had so many different kinds of pizzas! There are also a lot of bakeries in Città Alta and, I must say, if I hadn't walked all day every day, I may not have come back as skinny as I am.



In Il Centro, or the Center, there are many stores and restaurants as well. This was my favorite place to walk around, as long as I didn't go into Zara every time. In this part of the city is where they set up Il Mercatino di Natale, or the Christmas Market. This was my favorite part of being there because I was able to see what the city looked like at Christmas. They set up a huge Christmas tree and had Christmas music playing all the time around it. In II Mercatino di Natale they sold lots of candies, cheeses, prociuttos, jewelry, books, hats and Christmas ornaments. They also set up an ice rink near one of the museums. The city was decked out in Christmas lights down every street they could hang them.

When I left the city to return home, I felt like my heart was sick because I had such a good time that I never wanted to leave. Someday I will go back, whether as a tourist or maybe to retire. Whichever way I return to Italy, I will return someday to the beautiful land of pasta, fashion, wine and pizza. Italy is one of the most beautiful countries in the world, and don't let anyone tell you otherwise!

The Dante Alighieri Society was formed in Italy in July 1889 to "promote the study of the Italian language and culture throughout the world...independent of political ideologies, national, or ethnic origin or religious beliefs. The Society is the free association of people -not just Italians- but all people everywhere who are united by their love for the Italian language and culture and the spirit of universal humanism that these represent." The Society was named after Dante Alighieri (1265-1321), a pre-Renaissance poet from Florence, Italy. Dante, the author of *The Divine* Comedy, is considered the father of the Italian language. The Dante Alighieri Society of Pueblo, Colorado was founded by Father Christopher Tomatis on October 24, 1977 and ratified by the Dante Alighieri Society in Rome, Italy on December 3, 1977.


