How the pandemic affected Gagliano's Italian Market



What does a family grocery store and deli do when it is needs to survive a global pandemic, it has to persevere and change? In March 2020, we had to adapt our business to limited in person shopping, we choose to close the store to inperson shopping. That was hard given that for 99 years we survived the Great Depression, World War II rationing, and the economic downturn that Pueblo experienced in the 1980s. We went to curbside and call-in orders. We created a paper-guide of products at first that helped people see some but not all the products we carry. We thought that this would work for the initial two-week lockdown, but unfortunately it persisted, and we had to make a choice that would benefit us! How do we keep going and protect our parents who we wanted to keep safe? For us it was about them, over profits and we also did not want to have to fight with people to wear a mask. We would continue with our curbside shopping and adapt. We created a website using godaddy.com that would allow on-line shopping and allow people to view products and put in orders, we continued to take orders over the phone and installed a doorbell for people to inform us they were here for their orders. We were incredibly surprised regarding how well the online ordering took off. We started getting 15 to 20 online orders a day, that helped free up the phone, and outside ordering. We created posters and banners on the outside of the store that directed people to the website, that had pictures of the shelves, and the ability to order.

A few things also helped us as well, given that our customer base goes back four generations most of our customers new exactly what they wanted and where it's located. Our wholesale business had just expended into in getting our sausage in the local Safeway and Albertson's Stores, Springside Cheese Shop, Disanti Farms, DiTomaso Farms, Legree's and in over 30 restaurants In Pueblo area. As the pandemic continued, it was difficult for our staff running outside in the heat, cold, rain, snow but we were committed limiting our exposure by keeping our work family small and not getting exposed and having to close for 14 days as per health department orders. Can you imagine closing your business for 14 days and having to throw out all the perishable products every-time a person was exposed to someone with Covid-19? Not many people can, but we understood that it was better to have a limited business, that take a hit like that.

A big part missing was the cultural and family- home like setting that Gagliano's had fostered for over 99 years, so we had to increase our online presence. We increased our presence using Facebook and with over 7000 people following us we could engage with our customer. Our aim was to show more than the products we sold but show people that inside Tony and Josephine where doing what they had always do. We posted pictures of Josephine making cookies, making lasagnas, and Tony sitting in his chair upfront. We invited people into the store with the posts and hopefully engaged with them as well.

As vaccines become more available, we opened the doors after almost a year, with the confidence that everyone in our business was vaccinated and mask wearing had become a little more normalized. We also didn't have to worry about exposure and closing. Since we've opened our business has rebounded and experienced a grow that we are thankful for. We are about to celebrate 100 years of serving the Pueblo community on June 26, 2021 and plan to celebrate not only our business but our customers.
